Elected to the National Coalition for Food and Agricultural Research

I was honored Monday to be elected to the board of the National Coalition for Food and Agricultural Research. National C-FAR is "a nonprofit, nonpartisan, consensus-based and customer-led coalition that brings food, agriculture, nutrition, conservation and natural resource stakeholders together with the food and agriculture research community, serving as a forum and a unified voice in support of sustaining and increasing public investment at the national level in food and agricultural research, extension and education." Seventy agricultural businesses, universities, government agencies and ag associations including the National Grange make up the coalition that was formed in 2001.

"Through education and outreach efforts, National C-FAR is seeking to sustain and enhance federal funding for food and agricultural research, extension and education to help bring about research outcomes that provide a range of major public benefits, including:

- Safer, more nutritious, convenient and affordable foods delivered to sustain a well nourished, healthy population
- More efficient and environmentally friendly food, fiber and forest production
- Improved water quality, land conservation, wildlife and other environmental conditions
- Less dependence on non-renewable sources of energy
- Expanded global markets and improved balance of trade
- More jobs and sustainable rural economic development."

The National Grange has long been a supporter and advocate for agricultural research and extension and these priorities certainly match with our legislative policies.

Federal funding for research and development is vital, as the United States' funding for agricultural research lags behind that of other developed countries according to a 2021 report commissioned by Farm Journal Foundation and the American Farm Bureau Federation. Stagnant public funding for agricultural research is threatening the future vitality of U.S. food systems, posing risks to farmer productivity and profitability, the steady supply of affordable food for consumers, and ultimately global food security.

The report stresses that new innovations are crucial to enable farmers to increase their productivity and meet rising global demand for food, even as climate change intensifies. While private-sector funding for agricultural R&D has been increasing, U.S. public spending has been flat for the past decade.

NC-FAR also supports expanded public participation in setting priorities for research and funding. Grangers can contribute through our grassroots policy development and member advocacy. I'm pleased and proud to join the board of directors to work toward NC-FAR's mission and I look forward to promoting the Grange's priority research issues as identified through our resolution process.

Enroll in Healthcare Coverage today

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services is offering from now until August 15th, 2021 a new special enrollment period for healthcare coverage. This offer is available to residents in 36 states. Fill out your application online at HealthCare.gov, after filling out the application you have 30 days to enroll in a plan, and your healthcare coverage will start on the 1st of the next month.

Many people can qualify to save money, did you know that 9 out of 10 people who enroll are eligible for savings? People can now find plans with much lower premiums due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the COVID relief law. 4 out of 5 can find a plan for \$10 or less after the savings. This period also doesn't require you to have a special life plan such as childbirth or marriage to enroll in a marketplace plan. With this plan, you may qualify for more coverage than your existing plan, before changing make sure you consider how much you paid towards a

deductible. You can learn more at HealthCare.gov and start an application. Remember you only have until August 15th, 2021 to take advantage of this health coverage opportunity.

This program, is made possible thanks to generous funders, but there are a limited number of spots available. The deadline for all materials to be submitted by email to the National Grange Communications Department via email (kgwin@nationalgrange.org) is PRIOR to "start of business" (9 a.m. Eastern) Thursday, July 15th.

We strongly encourage those who have not participated in the program previously to apply and will be given the highest priority.

On July 12, 2021 the BMS (Bristol Myers Squib) What To Do With a Cancer Diagnosis project will be available on the National Grange and Retire Safe websites, but it will soon also be available in all local and state Grange mailboxes. This Project includes a six-part presentation giving you next step advice if you or a loved one ever get news that you have cancer. Information includes different treatment options, how to prepare medical documents, self-advocating, and a medical checklist. Hearing that you have cancer can come as a shock and you may not know where to begin in finding the right medical treatment or how to prepare if things take a turn for the worse.
